

## Princeton Prospect Foundation Report

## I. House Improvements

- The pillars in our basement taproom have been repainted from black and maroon to pastel teal and pink--in addition to improving lighting--fostering a more welcoming, bright, and safe space for interpersonal engagement.
- The repainting process of our Green Room has begun: members have designed and begun hand-painting murals depicting scenes of forests and greenery to promote a tranquil space (to be used for work and member-led meditation sessions).
- Terrace plans to break ground this summer on our long-planned renovation/extension, in which the outdoor deck, servery, and dining space will be extended, along with installations of a new rooftop terrace and a fire pit.

## II. Community Engagement

- Our annual, Terrace-exclusive charity event raised \$1,300 for the Petey Greene Program, a local, community-oriented organization that funds and facilitates the education of incarcerated students.
- Our Community Service ICC Chair organized Truckfest and Trick-or-Feed on Terrace's behalf, along with representatives from the other clubs. Truckfest allowed \$7,000 to be donated to both Meals on Wheels and Send Hunger Packing (\$14k total).

- Terrace carries on our legacy of openness through our commitment to bi-weekly live music events open to all Princeton students, as well as through our bi-annual open houses in which we welcome the greater Princeton community into our space.

## III. Sustainability

- We continue to compost and recycle.
- We continue to serve fourth course, an aptly named fourth course of the day served at 10:30 PM, in which members reuse dinner leftovers to cook a new meal. The practice significantly reduces Terrace's daily food waste.
- Terrace's annual gear was ordered to be printed on eco-friendly materials: shirts and hoodies are made primarily from recycled cotton and polyester fibers constructed from recycled plastic bottles.
- Terrace introduced the zero-plastic initiative for the bi-weekly events in which we are open to the larger Princeton University community. Patrons are now served beverages exclusively in our washable tumblers, thereby eliminating any use for plastic cups, producing absolutely zero plastic waste by the end of each night. This reduces our plastic consumption significantly.
