Princeton Prospect Foundation Report Wednesday, February 23, 2022 Ewan Curtis '23, Vice President of Cap and Gown Club

The Cap and Gown Club recognizes the importance of the cooperation of our Officers, Chairs and Graduate Board to provide a welcoming and inclusive environment for our members. The chairpersons have worked over the past year to improve the experience of the membership and increase the club's involvement in the community. We hope that Cap and Gown continues to be an inviting environment to our members and guests and serve as a place of growth for our members.

Community Outreach

Community Outreach Chairs encourage civic service by working with community partners to provide volunteer opportunities for membership and organizing events and fundraisers within the club. In addition, Community Outreach Chairs serve on the Community Service Inter-Club Council, which organizes the Trick or Feed fundraiser and TruckFest. In our time as Chairs, we encountered the challenge of serving our community during COVID-19 restrictions. We were determined to provide support to our community partners by fostering active service. We accomplished this by working alongside the Charter Club to organize an inter-club fundraiser. Microsoft agreed to match our donations, and with their help, Charter and Cap & Gown donated \$2,600 to Arm in Arm. We were proud to partner with Arm in Arm, an organization that supports people facing housing, job, and food insecurity in the Princeton area. In 2021, Arm in Arm prevented 139 evictions, completed 45,140 home food deliveries, and helped 38 clients gain employment through license restoration. After meeting with the Chief Development Officer at the organization, we hope to deepen and continue our partnership with future community outreach events. Furthermore, as Chairs, we supported Cap junior and senior independent work with our weekly "Thesis Spotlights". We sent a weekly email that spotlighted our members" incredible research on important social issues. We believe community service, if misinformed, can perpetuate more harm than good. Therefore, these spotlights served as an educational mechanism to inform our Cap community and appreciate the insightful work of our peers.

Technology

We also created a member duty schedule for the fall semester, and worked to make sure that members on duty were able to detect and deal with issues on nights out. Similarly, we worked with the officers to ensure that COVID protocols in the club were correctly followed. Overall, we focused on retaining Cap's reputation as one of the safest clubs on the Street, as well advancing the general knowledge of the membership on interpersonal, substance, and COVID safety issues.
